

Avalon Intermediate Enrolment Scheme

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (3) of the Education and Training Act 2020 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school. (All numbers are inclusive).

The Northern Boundary runs from the Hutt River across to the end of Stokes Valley Road. All streets and addresses in Stokes Valley are in zone. Addresses 1 - 221 odd and 2 - 236 even Eastern Hutt Road are in zone

The scheme then runs to Cambridge Terrace. Addresses 391 – 451 odd and 404 – 452 even Cambridge Terrace are in zone. Kowhai Street and Hewer Crescent are not in zone. The scheme then goes across the railway lines to Oxford Terrace. Address 281 – 331 odd and 298 – 356 even Oxford Terrace are in zone.

The scheme then runs along Hollard Grove and onto Colson Street. All addresses on Hollard Grove are in zone. Addresses 15 – 89 odd and 28 – 62 even Colson Street are in zone. It then runs along Cottle Street, all addresses on Cottle Street are in zone. The scheme then runs along High Street and onto Tennyson Avenue. Addresses 937 – 1407 odd and 972 – 1408 even High Street are in zone. All addresses on Tennyson Avenue are in zone.

The scheme then intersects Taita Drive, across Harcourt Werry Drive. And then back to the Hutt River. Addresses 103 – 1251 odd and 98 – 1250 even Taita Drive are in zone. Addresses on Avalon Park Drive and Jessie Donald Way are in zone. The scheme the runs along the Hutt River to Stokes Valley.

Where a property has two or more entrances on different streets, or where the actual address of a property is in dispute, only the rateable address as recognised by the local City Council will be considered to determine if the property is in or out of zone.



Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the order of priority specified in the Education and Training Act 2020.

One calendar month before the application deadline associated with each pre-enrolment period subsequent to the first, a Board must, by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school:

- confirm the already advertised dates for the receipt of applications and for the holding of the ballot
- state the likely number of out of zone places that remain available.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

<u>First Priority</u> This priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.

Second Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

Third Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.

Fourth Priority will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.

<u>Fifth Priority</u> will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.

Sixth Priority will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary, under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (1) of the Education and Training Act 2020. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
