

Remarkables Primary School (6783)

Enrolment Scheme

Effective from 16 December 2021

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (3) of the Education and Training Act 2020 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

The Home Zone takes addresses on both sides of the boundary roads mentioned in the description unless otherwise stated.

Starting from the intersection of Perkins Road and Frankton Road (SH 6A), the home zone follows:

- North-east along Frankton Road (SH 6A) until Yewlett Crescent
 - Including Marina Drive,
 - Including Cresta Lane,
 - Including Viscount Lane,
 - And including Sugar Lane
- South along Yewlett Crescent until Stewart Street
- West along Stewart Street until Lake Avenue
- South-east along Lake Avenue until Allan Crescent
 - Including Shoreline Road
- South-west along Allan Crescent until Boyes Crescent
- South along Boyes Crescent until Bridge Street
- South along Bridge Street until the end of Bridge Street
- From the end of Bridge Street jumps south-east to Kawarau Road (SH 6)
- South along Kawarau Road (SH 6) and then Kingston Road (SH 6) until Peninsula Road
- West along Peninsula Road until the end of Peninsula Road
 - Including all the side streets off of Peninsula Road
- East back along Peninsula Road until Kingston Road (SH 6)
- North-west back along Kingston Road (SH 6) and then Kawarau Road (SH 6) until the Kawarau River
- East along the northern bank of the Kawarau River until the Shotover River
- North along the western bank of the Shotover River until the Frankton-Ladies Mile Highway (SH 6)
- South-west along the southern side of the Frankton-Ladies Mile Highway (SH 6) until its intersection with Kawarau Road (SH 6) and Frankton Road (SH 6A)
- West along Frankton Road (SH 6A) until Perkins Road
 - Including Towne Place.

Transitional Arrangement

This provision has been approved for inclusion in the Remarkables Primary School enrolment scheme under Section 75(1)(a) of the Education and Training Act 2020.

The transitional arrangement is for families of currently enrolled students whose addresses become “out of zone” as a result of the amendment of this enrolment scheme.

Section 75 of the Education and Training Act 2020 states that;

“the Secretary may authorise an enrolment scheme to permit a student to enrol at the school as if the student lived in the home zone of the school if, -

- (a) in the case of an existing enrolment scheme whose home zone is amended, -
 - (i) the student lives outside the amended home zone; and
 - (ii) the student has a sibling who is enrolled at the school at the time that the amendment is implemented; and
 - (iii) the sibling, at the time that the amendment is implemented, lives inside the home zone as it was before the amendment; and
 - (iv) the student, at the time, of enrolment, lives inside the home zone as it was before the amendment.”

If applying for enrolment under this part of the Enrolment Scheme, the siblings name, and evidence of a sibling relationship may be required by the school.

[Section 75\(3\)](#) of the Education and Training Act 2020 sets out the definition of a “sibling” for these purposes.

The school will maintain a list of students enrolled at the time of the implementation of the enrolment scheme to enable determination of eligibility to enrol under this provision.

Note: That this is a very tightly defined concession. It would not apply to:

1. Children who move into the withdrawal area after the implementation of the enrolment scheme boundary amendment; or
2. Children of families/whanau who move out of the old zone after the implementation of the enrolment scheme boundary amendment.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

<u>First Priority</u>	This priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.
<u>Second Priority</u>	will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
<u>Third Priority</u>	will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
<u>Fourth Priority</u>	will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
<u>Fifth Priority</u>	will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
<u>Sixth Priority</u>	will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, Selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary, under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (1) of the Education and Training Act 2020. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
