Heaton Normal Intermediate (3372) Proposed Enrolment Scheme

(Updated to Education and Training Act 2020)

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

Addresses on both sides of boundary roads are considered in-zone unless specified otherwise.

Starting from the intersection of Bealey Avenue and Madras Street:

- West along Bealey Avenue to Colombo Street
- South along Colombo Street to the western side only of Cathedral Square
- South along the western side only of Cathedral Square to Colombo Street
- South along Colombo Street to Lichfield Street
- West along Lichfield Street to Oxford Terrace
- West along Oxford Terrace to Riccarton Avenue
- North west along Riccarton Avenue to the intersection with Deans Avenue
- North along Deans Avenue to Kilmarnock Street
- West along Kilmarnock Street to the railway line
- North along the railway line to Fendalton Road
- West along Fendalton Road to Idris Road
- North along Idris Road to Wairakei Road
- North west along Wairakei Road to Aorangi Road
- North east along Aorangi Road to Condell Avenue
- North west along Condell Avenue to the intersection with Hudson Street
 - Including addresses up to and including 148 Condell Avenue
- North east across the country to the southern end of Marble Wood Drive
- North east along Marble Wood Drive to Harewood Road
- South east along Harewood Road to the intersection with Main North Road
- North east along Main North Road to the intersection with Cranford Street
 - Including 147 Main North Road addresses
- South east along Cranford Street to Innes Road
- North east along Innes Road to Thames Street
 - Including addresses up to and including 243 Innes Road on the north side
- South east along Thames Street to Westminster Street
- South west along Westminster Street to Forfar Street
 - Including 162 Westminster Street
- South east along Forfar Street to Madras Street
- South along Madras Street to Bealey Avenue

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date that will be published by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places that can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

- 1. **First priority** is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.
- 2. **Second priority** must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school.
- 3. **Third priority** must be given to any student who is the sibling of a former student of the school.
- 4. **Fourth priority** must be given to any applicant who is the child of a former student of the school.
- 5. **Fifth priority** must be given to any applicant who is a child of an employee of the school's board or a child of a member of the school's board.
- 6. Sixth priority must be given to all other applicants.

Before the application deadline associated with each pre-enrolment period, a Board must, by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school:

- confirm the already advertised dates for the receipt of applications and for the holding of the ballot
- state the likely number of out of zone places that remain available.

If there are more applicants in any priority group than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with <u>instructions by the Secretary</u>, under <u>Schedule 20, Clause 3 (1)</u> of the Education and Training Act 2020. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school.

Applicants may be required to give proof of In Zone address, or proof to support their application if seeking enrolment under the Out of Zone priorities.

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (3) of the Education and Training Act 2020 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.
