

KARANGAHAKE SCHOOL (1763)

Enrolment Scheme

Effective from **Date**

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (3) of the Education and Training Act 2020 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

Year 1-6

All Year 1-6 students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

Starting at 7683 SH 2 (Karangahake) (SH 2 addresses below 7683 are not included) the boundary extends north east through the Coromandel Ranges (excluding Old Reservoir Rd, Jackson Rd, and Komata Reefs Road) and then south to cross SH 2 west of 3881 SH 2 (Waikino) (8331 SH 2 is not included in the zone).

From east of 8331 SH 2 (Waikino), the boundary extends south west, excluding Swetman Rd, Kennedy Rd and Dickey Flat Rd, to Mt Karangahake peak, and then north west to include Old Rotokohu Road but not Wright Road, Rotokohu Road or Thorp Road.

From the western end of Old Rotokohu Rd the zone extends north to 7683 SH 2 (Karangahake), where the zone began.

Year 7-8

All Year 7-8 students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

Starting at 7683 SH 2 (Karangahake) (SH 2 addresses below 7683 are not included) the boundary extends north east through the Coromandel Ranges (excluding Old Reservoir Rd, Jackson Rd, Komata Reefs Road and Scheltema Rd) to include Princes St and Poland St.

From north of Poland St, the boundary extends south and east, excluding Farrelly Rd, to cross north of 111 Old Waitekauri Rd to include Larsen Rd (addresses above 111 Old Waitekauri Rd are not included) and then east, crossing north of 91 Waitekauri Rd (addresses above 91 Waitekauri Rd are not included) to the Waitekauri River.

The boundary then follows the Waitekauri River south, to the confluence of the Waitekauri and Ohinemuri Rivers. From this point the zone extends south to cross Pukekauri Rd east of 243 Pukekauri Rd (addresses above 243 Pukekauri Rd are not included), and continues south, including Hollis Rd, to cross Waitawheta Rd east of 473 Waitawheta Rd (addresses above 473 Waitawheta Rd are not included). McLean Rd and Bellamys Rd are not included in the zone.

From east of 473 Waitawheta Rd the boundary continues south, including Franklin Rd, Spence Rd, Deam Rd, and Hume Rd, to the end of Franklin Rd. From the end of Franklin Rd, the zone extends north west, including Swetman Rd, Kennedy Rd and Dickey Flat Rd, to Mt Karangahake peak.

From Mt Karangahake peak, the boundary extends north west to include Old Rotokohu Road but not Wright Road, Rotokohu Road or Thorp Road.

From the western end of Old Rotokohu Rd the zone extends north to 7683 SH 2 (Karangahake), where the zone began.

Note: Both sides of all streets and roads included in the above description are included unless otherwise stated.

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority this priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.

Second Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

Third Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.

Fourth Priority will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.

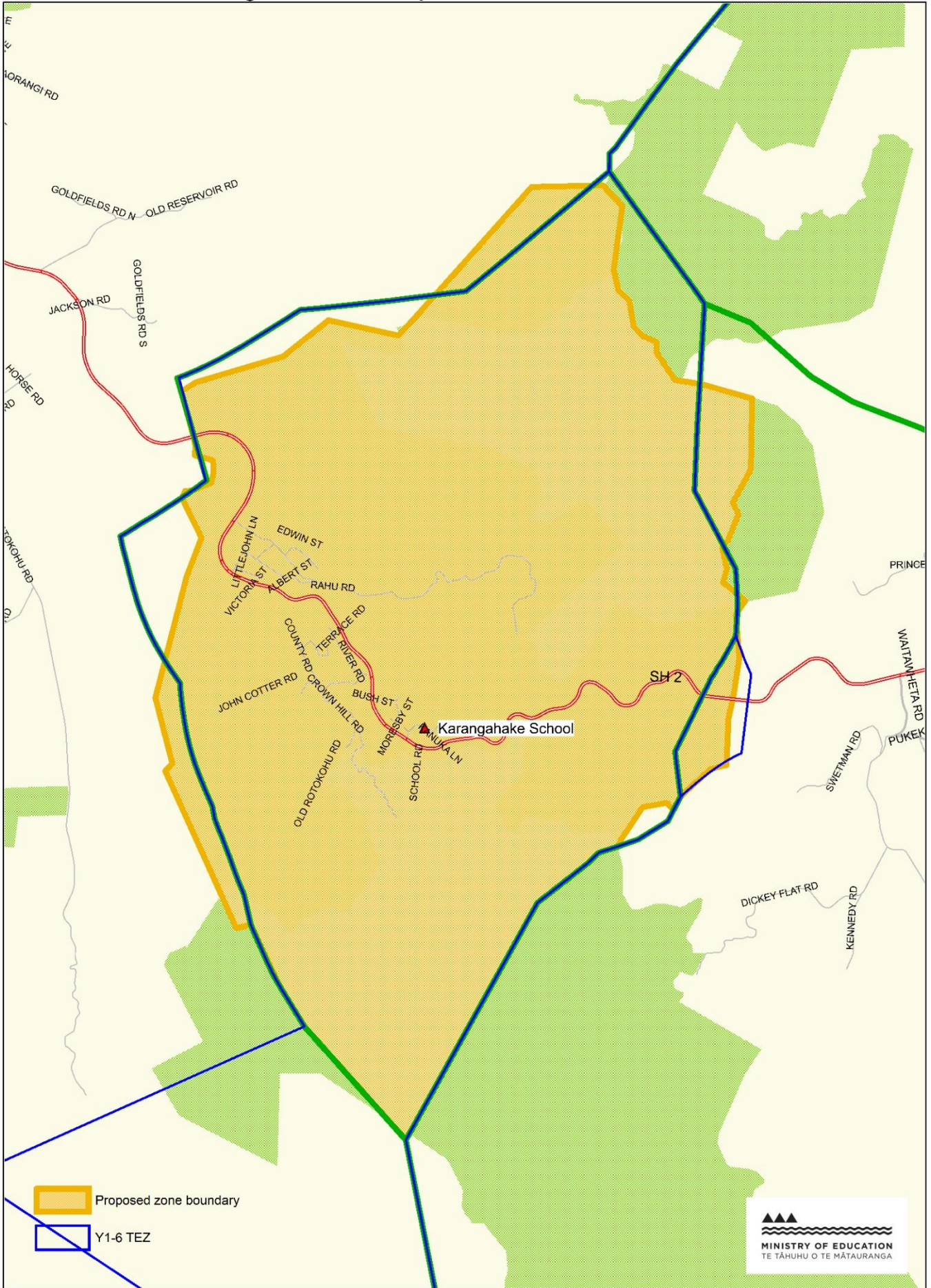
Fifth Priority will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.

Sixth Priority will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, Selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary, under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (1) of the Education and Training Act 2020. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
