

Pukerua Bay School Enrolment Scheme

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (3) of the Education and Training Act 2020 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school. (All numbers are inclusive).

The scheme rums along the coastline encompassing all of Pukerua Bay area. The scheme then runs across country to State Highway 1. Airlie Road and Coroglen Rise are NOT in zone. 310 – 468 State Highway 1 are in zone. The scheme then runs back along to the coastline including the land parcels that are part of Pukerua Bay.

The following streets are in zone; Gray Street, Teihana Road, Te Araroa Bypass, Wairaka Road, Pukerua Beach Road, Pa Road, Weku Road, Toenga Road, Te Ara Road and all road off these roads and any other street within Pukerua Bay are in zone.

All residential addresses on included sides of boundary roads and all no exit roads off included sides of boundary roads are included in the scheme unless otherwise stated.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date that will be published by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places that can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Where a property has two or more entrances on different streets, or where the actual address of a property is in dispute, only the rateable address as recognised by the local City Council will be considered to determine if the property is in or out of zone.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the order of priority specified in the Education and Training Act 2020.

One calendar month before the application deadline associated with each pre-enrolment period subsequent to the first, a Board must, by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school:

- confirm the already advertised dates for the receipt of applications and for the holding of the ballot.
- state the likely number of out of zone places that remain available.



Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority This priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a

special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.

Second Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students. **Third Priority** will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.

Fourth Priority will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school. will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the

board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.

Sixth Priority will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary, under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (1) of the Education and Training Act 2020. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
