# **SOUTHBROOK SCHOOL (3510)**

# **Proposed Enrolment Scheme**

### **Home Zone**

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

From the intersection of Townsend Road and South Belt

- South along the eastern side only of Townsend Road to Fernside Road
- North west along the south side only of Fernside Road to Easterbrook Road
- South along Easterbrook Road to Hicklands Road
- South east along Hicklands Road to Threlkelds Road
- North along Threlkelds Road to Skewbridge Road
  - o Including all addresses on Threlkelds Road north of the Cust River
- East along Skewbridge Road to Skewbank Lane
- East along Skewbank Lane to Lineside Road
- South east along the northern side only of Lineside Road to Revells Road
- East along the north side only of Revells Road to 23 Revells Road
- Due east to the Christchurch Northern Motorway (SH1) from the intersection of Lineside and Revells Road, then north along the western side only of the motorway to Main North Road (SH1)
- North east along Main North Road (SH1) to Pa Road
  - Includes Pineacres Holiday Park
- North west along Pa Road to Greens Road
- North west along Greens Road to Tuahiwi Road
- North along Tuahiwi Road to Waikoruru Road
- South west along Waikoruru Road to Camside Road
- North along Camside Road to Boys Road
- East along Boys Road to Northbrook Road
- North west along Northbrook Road to Victoria Street
- South west along Victoria Street to Percival Street
- South along Percival Street to Johns Road
  - Including Percival Street addresses #67 and below
- West along Johns Road to King Street
- South along King Street to Charles Street
- West along Charles Street to Martyn Street
  - Including all addresses on Charles Street between Martyn Street and Green Street
- South along Martyn Street to Rowse Street
- South west along Rowse Street to South Belt
  - o Including all addresses on Larry Devlin Lane, Thomas Lane and Oak Tree Lane
- West along South Belt to Pentecost Road
- West along the south side only of South Belt to the intersection with Townsend Road

Addresses on both sides of boundary roads are considered in-zone unless specified otherwise.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date that will be published by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places that can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

## **Special Programmes**

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

### Additional Entitlement to Enrol

For families of currently enrolled students whose addresses became out of zone as a result of the **1 Jan 2022** amendment to this Enrolment Scheme.

This provision was approved under Section 75 1(a) of the Education and Training Act 2020.

## Section 75 of the Education and Training Act 2020 states that;

"the Secretary may authorise an enrolment scheme to permit a student to enrol at the school as if the student lived in the home zone of the school if, -

- (a) in the case of an existing enrolment scheme whose home zone is amended,
  - I. the student lives outside the amended home zone; and
  - II. the student has a sibling who is enrolled at the school at the time that the amendment is implemented; and
  - III. the sibling, at the time that the amendment is implemented, lives inside the home zone as it was before the amendment; and
- IV. the student, at the time of enrolment, lives inside the home zone as it was before the amendment:

If applying for enrolment under this part of the Enrolment Scheme, the sibling's name and evidence of a sibling relationship may be required by the school.

<u>Section 75</u> of the Education and Training Act 2020 sets out the definition of a "sibling" for these purposes.

The school will maintain a list of students enrolled at the time of the implementation of the enrolment scheme change by the Board in order to enable determination of eligibility to enrol under this provision.

Note: That this is a very tightly defined definition. It would not apply to:

- 1. Children who move into the withdrawal area after the implementation of the enrolment scheme boundary amendment; or
- 2. Children of families/whānau who move out of the old zone after the implementation of the enrolment scheme boundary amendment.

#### **Out of Zone Enrolments**

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

- 1. **First priority** is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.
- 2. **Second priority** must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school.

- 3. **Third priority** must be given to any student who is the sibling of a former student of the school.
- 4. **Fourth priority** must be given to any applicant who is the child of a former student of the school.
- 5. **Fifth priority** must be given to any applicant who is a child of an employee of the school's board or a child of a member of the school's board.
- 6. Sixth priority must be given to all other applicants.

Before the application deadline associated with each pre-enrolment period, a Board must, by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school:

- confirm the already advertised dates for the receipt of applications and for the holding
  of the ballot.
- state the likely number of out of zone places that remain available.

If there are more applicants in any priority group than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with <u>instructions by the Secretary</u>, under <u>Schedule 20</u>, <u>Clause 3 (1)</u> of the Education and Training Act 2020. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school.

Applicants may be required to give proof of address or sibling relationship.

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (3) of the Education and Training Act 2020 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.
