New Enrolment Scheme

Overview – what is changing?

The Ministry of Education regularly monitors enrolment patterns, population growth and anticipated school roll changes across the Tai Tokerau district. As part of this monitoring and regular review, we now consider an enrolment scheme is necessary for Tautoro School. This is due to growth of the school roll and because we need to ensure the Board has a fair and transparent mechanism to manage the roll. It also means we can ensure we are making best use of educational facilities across the wider Tautoro area.

The new enrolment scheme will have a home zone, like other schools with enrolment schemes in the area. Children that live within this area will have entitlement to enrol at Tautoro School. The home zone area is shown on the map below and described here:

TAUTORO SCHOOL (2101) **Enrolment Scheme** Effective from **2 May 2022**

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under section 72 (2) of the Education and Training Act 2020 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below (and shown on the attached map) shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

The Home Zone takes addresses on both sides of the boundary roads mentioned in the description unless otherwise stated.

The zone includes all addresses from 4926 to 6730A,B,C,D Mangakahia Road inclusive. Ngapuhi Road. Station Road. Picadilly Road. Waimatenui Road from numbers 417 to 2508 inclusive. Whiu Road. Tawata Road. Wharepunga Road up to and including number 466. Parrott Road. Steward Road. Waimatenui Mataraua Road. Parker Road. Otaenga Road. Adams Road. Tokawhero Road. Gammons Road. Knudsens Road. Orakau Road up to and including number 1375. Matene Road. Gerrard Road. Ngapipito Road up to and including number 1087. Rakautao Road.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

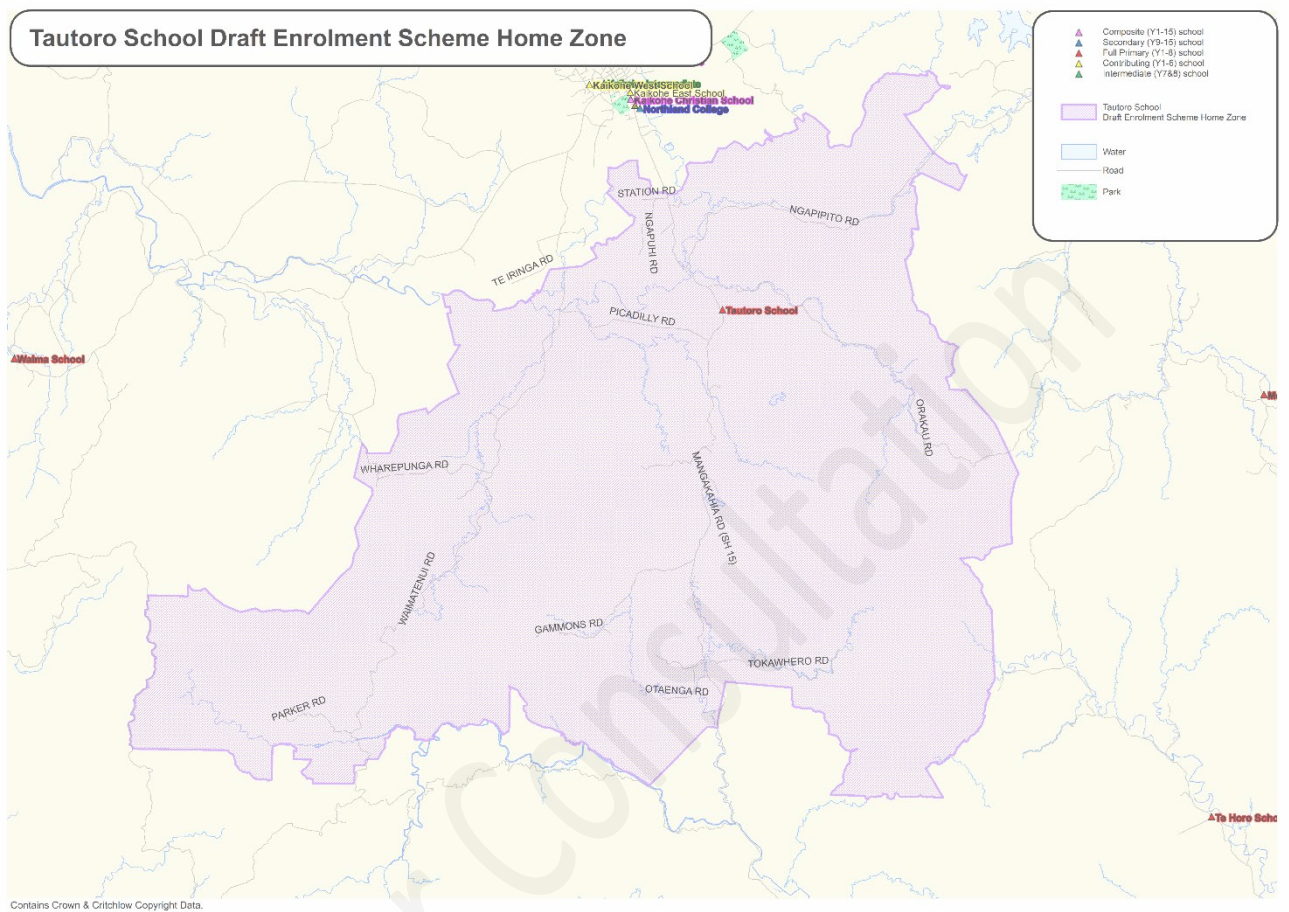
<u>First Priority</u>	This priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.
<u>Second Priority</u>	will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
<u>Third Priority</u>	will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
<u>Fourth Priority</u>	will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
<u>Fifth Priority</u>	will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
<u>Sixth Priority</u>	will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, Selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary issued under clause 3(1) of Schedule 20 of the Education and Training Act 2020.

Under Secretary's Instructions Number 5, parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a medium appropriate for the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.

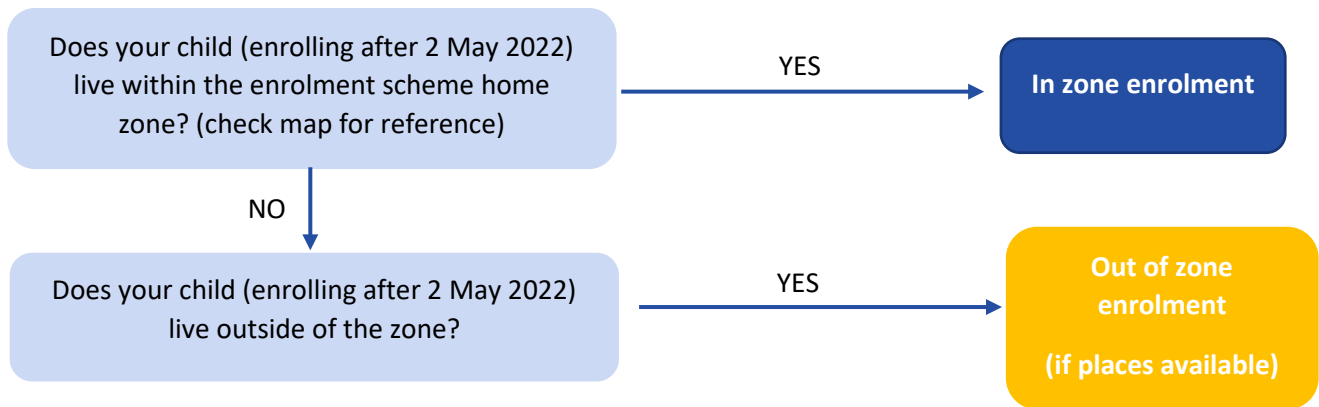
Home zones



What does this mean for my family?

Any student currently enrolled at Tautoro School will not be impacted by the new enrolment scheme. All students enrolled (and attending school) will be entitled to continue attending Tautoro School, irrespective of where they currently live.

The change to the home zone will affect all enrolments starting after 2 May 2022. This includes current families who have a younger sibling looking to enrol at Tautoro School and starting 2 May 2022 or later. The flowchart below will help you assess your indicative eligibility to enrol from 2 May 2022.

Consultation will run until **22 December 2021**. The Ministry will consider all feedback and consult with the Tautoro School Board before making a final decision. We expect the school community to be updated about progress made **1 March 2022**. The new scheme and changes will come into effect for Term 2 2022 (2 May 2022) enrolments.
