Te Mata School (Raglan) (2010) Enrolment Scheme

Effective from Date

The development and operation of enrolment schemes is undertaken under authority granted under Schedule 20 of the Education and Training Act 2020, which describes the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

The 'home zone' commences at 1711 Kawhia Road (as per the school's Transport Entitlement Zone) and travels east along Kawhia Road to the intersection with Makomako Road.

Turn right into Makomako Road and travel to its end. From the end of Makomako Road take direct lines to the ends of Shea Road, Plateau Road, Houchen Road and Pond Road, then follow Pond Road to the intersection with Te Mata Road.

Turn right into Te Mata Road and travel along to the intersection of Te Mata Road and State Highway 23.

From the intersection of Te Mata Road and State Highway 23 the boundary extends to the intersection of Maungatawhiri Road and State Highway 23 (Nau Mai Road/Centrebush Lane are not in-zone, Somerset Lane is in-zone).

From the intersection of Maungatawhiri Road and State Highway 23 take 'direct lines' to cross Te Hutewai Road north of 233 Te Hutewai Road (addresses below 233 Te Hutewai Road are not in-zone, Benseman Road is in-zone.

From north of 233 Te Hutewai Road the boundary extends south west to include Waimaunga Road, Ruapuke Road, Karioi Road, to 1109 Whaanga Road (addresses below 1109 Whaanga Road are not in-zone) and then a direct line to the coast.

Follow the coast south to a point on the coast that stretches directly across the Aotea Harbour back to where the zone commenced at 1711 Kawhia Road.

Note: Both sides of all streets and roads included in the above description are included unless otherwise stated.

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

- **<u>First Priority</u>** this priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.
- **Second Priority** will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
- **Third Priority** will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- **Fourth Priority** will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- **<u>Fifth Priority</u>** will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- **Sixth Priority** will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, Selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary, under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (1) of the Education and Training Act 2020. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
